

MSc European Forestry – Mid-term report

MSc European Forestry studies are designed in such a way that graduating within two years is feasible. By now, you should have completed all your compulsory and elective courses, except for the final task; composing the MSc thesis.

Returning this report serves two purposes. Firstly, for you, it serves the purpose of checking that you have fulfilled all the requirements to eventually be awarded a double-degree. Secondly, for us, it serves the purpose of acquiring up-to-date information on the progress of your studies allowing us to update your study information in WebOodi.

If you have completed all the courses that you described in your study plan last autumn, all you need to do now is to ask your thesis supervisor to sign the statement on the other side and then send this paper together with a current, official transcript of your study records to Joensuu.

If the transcript does not include all the courses that you should have completed in your host university, you must explain their lacking and ask the local MSc EF coordinator¹ to approve the explanation. Similarly, if your thesis supervisor disagrees upon the progress of your thesis, you must have the report signed by the local coordinator.

You are expected to graduate during the coming summer. However, if for any reason your graduation within the next six months does not seem likely, the consortium has the right to contemplate your performance and take necessary measures accordingly. If you fail to return this report in time, your local coordinator will automatically be contacted for further discussion.
